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### REVIEWS

#### Have a Go News, Perth, 1<sup>st</sup> October 2019

The colour is dark plum with purple hues. The aromas are a complex mix of dark berry fruits and hints of cassis and mint combined with chocolate and cedar from the oak. The palate of dark berry fruits flavours of cedar, dark chocolate and spice and a long, lingering finish. The winemaker says you could cellar this wine for up to 15 years

#### Casey Ewers, Travelling Corkscrew Perth, 20<sup>th</sup> August 2019

It's a deep ruby red colour in the glass. On the nose it's full of rich black fruits, a bait of tar, a few squares of dark chocolate and a handful of coffee beans. While in the mouth its full bodies and nicely rounded with a clean, dry tannic finish. Wood smoked berries and chocolate come to mind.

Classic Coonawarra. Give this time and it will unfurl furthermore. You can rely on Katnook delivering the goods. There's a soft touch about the fruit with good width and a moreish length. Drink 2021 to 10 years+ 91/100

Winning an "excellent" category in Langton's much-vaunted classification of Australian wine is a hard-earned honour and this Coonawarra beaut reveals a myriad of reasons how it made the cut. Its generously intense fruit flavours coupled with near perfect oak maturation guarantee memorable satisfaction.

#### Stuart Robinson, The Vinsomniac, 1<sup>st</sup> June 2019

I didn't necessarily pick this as a Coonawarra wine at initial sight. It's subtle, yet rich with ripe black fruit, in the blackcurrant/cassis mould. I suppose what I mean by that regional ignorance is a lack of distinct eucalypt, which I guess is often what leads the way for that regional/variety construct. That fruit profile flows through the palate, the grainy tannin profile and freshening acidity perhaps more of a regional marker. Needs a little time to gel, to pull together. 92

#### Dan Trauki, Wine Assist's, 1<sup>st</sup> June 2019

A delightful bouquet, with vibrant red fruit aromas, a hint of cassis & some vanillin oak, complex palate that has great structure, multiple layers of flavour & a nice tight finish. In time it will evolve into a classic Coonawarra Cabernet.

#### James Suckling, Jamessuckling.com, 4<sup>th</sup> June 2019

89 points

Plenty of fresh redcurrants on the nose here with a focused palate that has a bold, ripe red-plum finish. Drink or hold. Screw cap.

#### Peter Bourne, Australian Gourmet Traveller, March 2019

A rich, layered palate of dark berry fruits and hints of mulberry complement perfectly integrated oak maturation flavours and soft, fine-grained tannins. A rich, deep and intensely flavoured take on Coonawarra cabernet sauvignon.
